


Wild Geese by Mary Oliver:

"You do not have to be good. You do not have to walk on your knees for a hundred miles through the desert, repenting. You only have to let the soft animal of your body love what it loves. Tell me about despair, yours, and I will tell you mine. Meanwhile the world goes on. Meanwhile the sun and the clear pebbles of the rain are moving across the landscapes, over the prairies and the deep trees, the mountains and the rivers. Meanwhile the wild geese, high in the clean blue air, are heading home again. Whoever you are, no matter how lonely, the world offers itself to your imagination, calls to you like the wild geese, harsh and exciting over and over announcing your place in the family of things."

Greeting's members and friends of First Presbyterian Church of Victor,

The poem above reminds me time and again that I am not perfect, and that I am allowed to fail, but also more than anything reminds me that I am to be a person of grace. That is 100% true for all of you as well; you do not have to be perfect, and you are allowed to fail, and you are also a person of grace. You might not know this about me, but for the longest time I was not able to give myself grace when I made mistakes or failed to live up to either my expectations or others' expectations of me. Nowhere was the sting of guilt more pointed and painful than my relationship with God. It all changed when I sat at a meeting of Pastors and Elders from the RCA equivalent to Presbytery called the Classis. At the Rochester Classis meeting in the summer of 2011 as I was about to become a candidate for ordained ministry, I spoke about college, my learning I had done in my Christian Ministry program, and my calling to ministry. I named all the guilt, hang-ups I had, and the desire to live a morally pure and upright life as a Christian. As I mentioned in my sermon on May 16, my early understanding of Christianity was that there were all these steps I had to do to earn God's grace and love. I felt this way at this meeting with the Classis.




A wonderful and gracious Pastor in the Classis asked me this question: "do you have a hard time giving yourself grace?" The question itself cut through the pretension and guilt I had been feeling. I was alarmed by the question; it was harsh and exciting to think that grace could be something we showed toward ourselves! In the conversation that followed I learned that I had been way too hard on myself. I was trying to be perfect, but as a result was feeling more and more guilty. A cloud lifted that day and I realized what Mary Oliver's poem says in its opening lines to be true: I didn't have to be 'good,' I didn't have to shamefully "crawl on my knees through a desert landscape repenting" time and again for all of the things I had ever done wrong. Purity, perfection, guilt, shame, and all the other practices I had been doing to try and tame sin in my life were exhausting attempts of my own doing to try and make myself holy and right with God. Have you ever felt any of those? Have you ever felt like you weren't living up to your own expectations or of the expectations of those around you?

"Indeed, the word of God is living and active, sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing until it divides soul from spirit, joints from marrow; it is able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart."

I mention this poem, and my experience here, hoping that it will be encouraging as you reflect on your own life and experience of grace. Let me be pastoral and speak into your life: "you can give yourself some grace when you fail and when you make mistakes." As humans it is bound to happen, and as Christians we are not excluded from trying hard to become better, failing at it, and trying again. We all have things we have despair over; we all have things we have guilt over, but as Christians we also have this altogether wonderful and life changing truth that we are claimed by God's love and forgiveness. We name in the Lord's prayer every week a desire for God to forgive us as we forgive one another. Sometimes I think we need to offer forgiveness and grace to ourselves, because all too often we are our own worst critic, are we not? I find that I am often harsher and more unforgiving of my own faults than I am of others.

The invitation today as you read this is to look back and reflect on the past year and a half and offer grace and forgiveness to others, and to situations. All of us have had despair and longing over the time we have spent in the pandemic. We have been let down in one way or another. We have all grieved different losses as well as the ways our expectations and needs have not been met. As a church community there is the tremendous loss of connection, usual habits, fellowship, ministry, and add to that the loss of Pastor Colin at the end of last year as he took another call. Perhaps even in the past few months with my arrival as your Interim there has been continued grief, frustration, and perhaps your expectations of me have left you feeling let down as well. Personally, and corporately as the congregation, we must be willing to offer grace and love. We aren't flippant about it. We do not do so without also offering accountability for our actions, but we do this knowing that healing for all that has been, can only come through grace and forgiveness.

Re-read Mary Oliver's poem now. Join with me as we look to the final couple lines to be a rededication of our lives to one another, God, and this community. "Whoever you are, no matter how lonely, the world offers itself to your imagination, calls to you like the wild geese, harsh and exciting — over and over announcing your place in the family of things..." As we let our bodies 'love what we love,' as the world calls out to us 'harsh and exciting,' might we wonder together about 'our place in the family of things...

In closing let me say this: "I love you all for who you are and who you are becoming, and I offer you forgiveness, grace, and my commitment to do the good and hard work of being transformed together as a community. My hope is that you would offer the same for me and for each other."







*gift cards to Bristol's or Home Depot to purchase plants and materials.


*zucchini plants *acorn squash plants *spaghetti squash plants *butternut squash plants *summer squash plants




