The following is part of the "Foundations of Presbyterian Polity" of our Book of Order (Constitution of the PC USA Part II). It is a wonderful few words about the nature of who we are, and who we are to be, together in this shared community of faith.

F-1.03 THE CALLING OF THE CHURCH

F-1.0301 The Church Is the Body of Christ

The Church is the body of Christ. Christ gives to the Church all the gifts necessary to be his body. The Church strives to demonstrate these gifts in its life as a community in the world (1 Cor. 12:27–28):

The Church is to be a community of faith, entrusting itself to God alone, even at the risk of losing its life.

The Church is to be a community of hope, rejoicing in the sure and certain knowledge that, in Christ, God is making a new creation. This new creation is a new beginning for human life and for all things. The Church lives in the present on the strength of that promised new creation.

The Church is to be a community of love, where sin is forgiven, reconciliation is accomplished, and the dividing walls of hostility are torn down.

The Church is to be a community of witness, pointing beyond itself through word and work to the good news of God's transforming grace in Christ Jesus its Lord.

In the hours of respite you may have in the days ahead, think on these things: how can we together, and each of us individually, be a people of faith, hope, love, and witness? Building on the strong foundation of who we are, and what we do now, how might we embody ever more fully being the Body of Christ?


LABELS FOR EDUCATION

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE

Treasurer's Report

April regular pledged income (not including capital campaign gifts) was \$708 above budget and \$4,452 above 2015. Operating income for the period was \$1,471 below budget, but \$2,176 above 2015. Capital income from the Serve Abundantly campaign was sufficient to cover most of the minimum loan payment. April's operating expenses were \$289 over budget and \$2,219 above 2015. Loan principal and interest payments in April were \$3,039 in 2016 vs. \$4,039 in 2015. Per capita contributions year-to-date were \$263 below budget, but \$263 above 2015. 52 of our members have paid 2016 per capita.

The per capita (i.e., per person) assessment for 2016 is \$29.80 PER MEMBER. This is the annual administrative charge from the wider church, and is based on the number of confirmed members reported to Presbytery each year. If there are confirmed members in your household, including teens and young adults, we ask that you help us defray this expense by paying your portion. Blue Per Capita envelopes are available at the Welcome Center in the church foyer and on the table in the front of the sanctuary.

Please try to stay current with your pledges to help us meet our basic expenses. If you are going to be away for an extended time, please mail your contributions to the church office. You may also sign up at any time for regular electronic funds transfer of your pledge payments. Please see me for the required form or ask me any questions about this convenient way to stay current with your contributions.

SERVE ABUNDANTLY UPDATE

As the 3 years originally designated for our Serve Abundantly capital campaign draws to a close this month, it seems appropriate to update everyone on the results to date. Of \$290,000 originally pledged by 89 households, \$264,573 has been paid. 67 pledges are fully paid (\$229,700) and 8 others are more than 80% paid (\$20,015 of \$22,340 pledged). The remaining 14 pledgers (\$34,890) have paid \$11,265. \$3,593 has been received from unpledged donors, including the former Women's Association. This leaves \$26,000 in pledges unpaid.

We completed exterior painting of the church and remodeling of the kitchen. We donated \$15,000 to Jesus Wells in India as the mission portion of this effort. And we have reduced our building loan balance from about \$191,000 in April 2013 to under \$30,000 as of the end of May 2016, saving over \$34,000 in interest. Our goal is to have this balance paid off by the end of this summer.

The remaining pledges to be paid will not be enough to completely pay off our building loan; however, we plan to take funds from our capital reserve to pay the remaining balance in July. Pledged (or unpledged) funds received after that time will be used to replenish the capital reserve. It's not too late to help us "burn the mortgage"! Please use the yellow Serve Abundantly envelopes or mark your check with "capital fund". Thanks to all who have contributed to the success of this 3-year effort!
