“For through the law I died to the law, so that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; 20 and it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God,[g] who loved me and gave himself for me”

-Galatians 2:19-20

Grace and Peace to you members and friends:

This side of Easter it is always good for us to recall how the early church was formed and see what life and faith development looked like for early Christians. Sometimes I steer away from Paul's letters because they can be confusing because of the terms he uses, but also because too often Christians take pieces literally when Paul was writing to a vastly different audience than our own. Here above is a scripture that I think is pretty plain and simple even for Paul. I am struck by the words “it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me.” In a world full of “me first” as the mentality and personal independence and personal reputation as badges of success; this scripture speaks out in stark contrast to those ideals. Paul is essentially saying here that his reputation does not matter any longer since he became a follower of Christ. For so many of us this probably doesn't feel right or like something we should do.

Paul sees himself as crucified with Christ, which means that he is linking his identity into the action of the crucifixion. It's another way for Paul to say that his life, his reputation and his identity need(ed) to die. Paul's conversion is one of the more popular stories from the New Testament. He was a pharisee, well known, well educated, and respected among his peers. He was asked to find the people who talked about Jesus after Jesus' death, and get them to stop talking about Jesus. Paul was confronted by Jesus in a vision, struck blind, and told to stop persecuting

Jesus' followers. Paul is converted and changes to become the biggest promoter of Jesus and what Christianity stands for. Paul truly did give up his reputation, his prestige, and took on a new life.

In a similar way as Christ's followers in the 21st century we are also called to consider our lives and reputations. Ask yourself these questions: am I willing to let my reputation go, or my successes (no matter how large) go? Am I willing to do the same with my status at work? What my friends think? What my church thinks etc...?

I believe that unless we are willing to let ourselves, like Paul, trade away status for knowing Christ we will always think more highly of ourselves and be kept from growth in our faith. Not only that we will miss out on knowing how God's Spirit can move and work through us.

FROM THE WORSHIP COMMITTEE

The worship committee has been busy working with Pastor Nick in trying to create the best possible worship experience for all who partake either in person or on YouTube. Some of the things that we have been working on is the upcoming Holy Week starting with Palm Sunday, March 28 to Good Friday, April 2 and culminating with Easter on April 4th when there will be 2 services; one at 9:00AM and the other at 11:00AM.

It is the belief of everyone involved that the services are more enriching with the inclusion of different voices throughout the time of worship. For that reason we are looking for people interested or willing to take on the role of **liturgist**. That includes parts of the service such as the Call to Worship, Prayer of Confession and Pardon and reading of the scriptures, but could be a variation of any of these. The person providing the liturgy can do so *in person or through a recording* with either just the audio or with it including yourself on video. For the major services such as Easter we would prefer to have that be in person. Another form of providing additional voices is through **leadership of the hymns** on Sunday mornings. This too can be offered in person or through a recording. We encourage those with little or a lot of vocal talent to offer yourself in leadership, we promise you that judging will not take place.

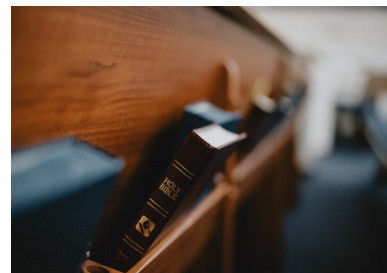

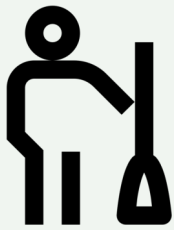
VICTOR-FARMINGTON FOOD CUPBOARD

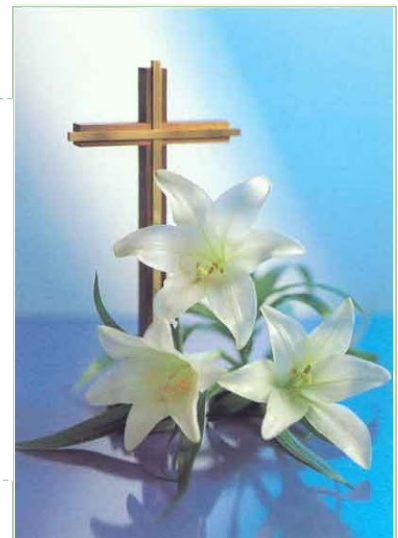
EASTER LILIES

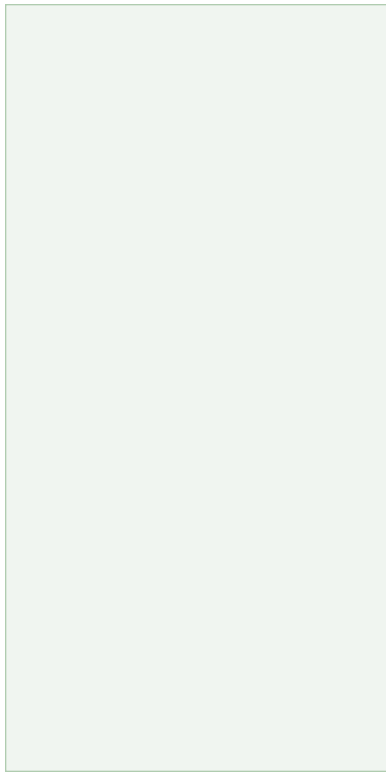
