Scripture Reading

1 Peter 2:2-10

Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation— if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good.

Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture:

Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, but if you do not, then believe because of the works themselves. Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it.

Please join us after worship today to explore how the church might live out our mission to our congregation and the community, especially concerns around mental health from a holistic (spirit, mind, body) perspective. Some have expressed interest in the labyrinth, a meditative prayer walk that is often used therapeutically. (Marti Mowers knows more about this.) Joy will do a brief presentation to introduce the labyrinth as part of our discussion.

Last year's congregational mission study identified mental health as an important way to touch the lives of people in Victor. A \$1,000 grant from the Presbytery is available, with the application due May 15, to help fund whatever you discern as God's work for you. This after-worship session is a first step in this discernment process and will focus on the Presbytery grant application due soon.
