One of the main reasons someone who is homeless goes to the emergency room is because of a foot ailment and the best way to prevent that is be able to wear clean dry socks on a regular basis. If we can offer a simple piece of clothing such as new, fresh socks, feet can be protected from getting cold, getting wet, and getting blisters or worse.

Socks are the least-donated clothing items and yet the most in-demand for needy locals. People very rarely donate socks. Just think about it. When your old clothes wear out, or go out of style, most people simply donate them to a good cause. But what do people do with their old socks? They usually throw them out because they are worn out. A homeless person asking for new clothes at a shelter will normally get everything – except new socks. And that's sad. If you put yourself in someone else's shoes (no pun intended), you can see how clean, warm socks are a true treasure.

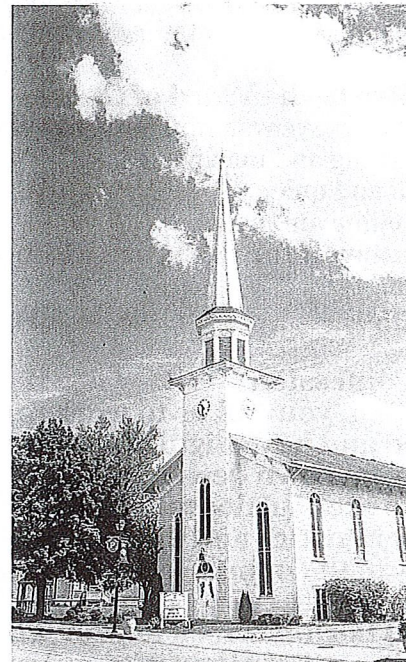
