



## Sunday School News

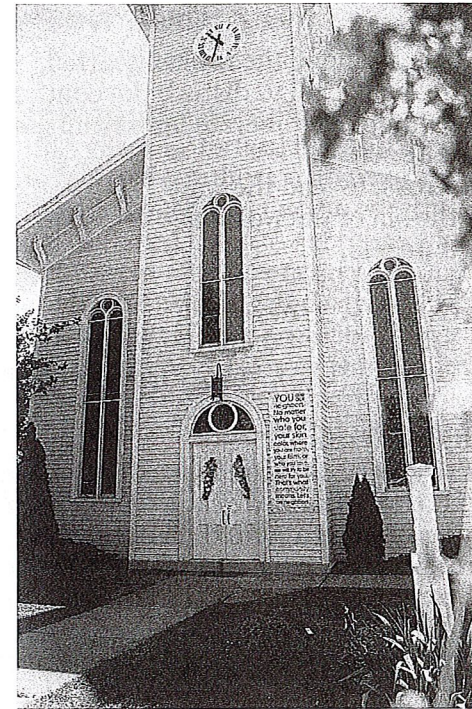
