We are thrilled that Erica Ekholm is back in town and will lead the youth group.



Scripture Reading 1 Samuel 16:1-13

The LORD said to Samuel, "How long will you grieve over Saul? I have rejected him from being king over Israel. Fill your horn with oil and set out; I will send you to Jesse the Bethlehemite, for I have provided for myself a king among his sons."

Samuel said, "How can I go? If Saul hears of it, he will kill me." And the LORD said, "Take a heifer with you, and say, 'I have come to sacrifice to the LORD.'

Invite Jesse to the sacrifice, and I will show you what you shall do; and you shall anoint for me the one whom I name to you."

Samuel did what the LORD commanded, and came to Bethlehem. The elders of the city came to meet him trembling, and said, "Do you come peaceably?" Jesse made seven of his sons pass before Samuel, and Samuel said to Jesse, "The LORD has not chosen any of these."

Samuel said to Jesse, "Are all your sons here?" And he said, "There remains yet the youngest, but he is keeping the sheep." And Samuel said to Jesse, "Send and bring him; for we will not sit down until he comes here." He sent and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, and had beautiful eyes, and was handsome. 



Emergency Shelter Guest Updates: We are currently hosting 6 single moms, 1 single dad, and 24 children in our Emergency Shelter Apartments, and one just-vacated apartment is open.

- Geneva: We lease two emergency apartments on Elm Street. One of those recently became vacant when the mom and her baby moved into permanent supportive housing. A mom with three children - two with special needs - is sheltering in our new Bristol Street apartment.

Giff Card Support for Families: With the reduction of SNAP benefits to pre-pandemic levels, more summer or fall. I've heard back from most of you. Our families will be grateful for your help keeping for help with gas and grocery cards during one week in the winter or spring and a second week in the families than ever are facing food insecurity. While the reference to Jesus as the Light of the world (John 8:12, 9:5) can be understood generally, this hymn is perhaps best understood as a response to the Transfiguration (Matthew 17:1–8/Mark 9:2–8/Luke 9:28–36). This is the most popular of the author/composer's many songs.

The author/composer of this unrhymed hymn regards it as a meditation and prayer deeply rooted in many scriptures, most connected with the theme of light: Genesis 1:17; Fsalm 139:12; Isaiah 60:19; Malachi 4:2; John 14:8; Ephesians 5:8; Hebrews 12:1–2; 1 John 1:5; Revelation 21:23.
