SESSION MODERATOR

During our transition to an Interim Pastor we are fortunate to have a Moderator from the Presbytery of Genesee Valley. Rev. Bruce Boak will be moderating our Session and Congregational Meetings and shared this short bio.

Rev. Bruce Boak is a retired pastor in the Presbytery of Genesee Valley. During his ministry he served four congregations:

Bessemer Presbyterian Church, Bessemer, PA, Central Presbyterian Church, Downingtown, PA, Christ Presbyterian Church, Canton, OH, and First Presbyterian Church, Pittsford, NY.

For 46 summers he has been a summer pastor at Wells Memorial Presbyterian Church on the island of Avalon, NJ. Bruce is a graduate of Grove City College and Princeton Theological Seminary. INTERIM PASTOR SEARCH PROCESS

WHO: The Session is responsible for the search; it may delegate to a committee. The Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Victor has delegated the search to the Interim Search Committee which is comprised of Megan Antonitto, Jan Astles, Kelsey Bright, Carol Fowler, Steve Mowers, and Rich Cromwell. The committee will recommend a candidate for approval by Session. The Session makes a contract with an interim pastor subject to Committee on Ministry approval. The congregation does not call an interim.

WHAT: Interim pastors are called by God to serve in transition times.

•a guide in transition

- •a comfort to the congregation during unsettled times
- •a source of freedom for the search process for the next installed

"Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." ~Philippians 4:6



WHY: Interim pastors help congregations grieve the loss of the former pastor, understand ministry in today's context, look towards the future, and prepare to welcome new installed leadership. The interim pastor may not become the next installed pastor.

- **HOW:** Here is our pathway to and progress towards an interim pastor (a check mark indicates that the task has been completed):
 - ✓ The Committee on Ministry (COM) liaison meets with Session to introduce the process.
 - ✓ The Session decides who (what group/committee) will conduct the search and whether and how far to search beyond the presbytery.
 - The Presbytery Leader and COM provide names of possible local interims.
 - ✓ The Interim Search Committee reviews the ministry information form focused on transition.
 - The Interim Search Committee creates a job description for the interim pastor.
 - □ The Session approves the job description for the interim pastor.
 - □ The Interim Search Committee conducts interviews with candidates.
 - The Interim Search Committee conducts reference checks on finalist(s).
 - The Interim Search Committee recommends a final candidate to Session.
 - The Presbytery Leader does reference checks on any interim who is being seriously considered.
 - □ COM conducts a clearance interview.
 - The Session approves the candidate, Covenant Agreement, and Terms of Call.
 - The signed Covenant Agreement and Terms of Call then go to the COM for their approval.
 - Interim is introduced to congregation and begins work.
