FROM PASTOR COLIN

Little Resurrections

I've just finished serving as a commissioner from the Presbytery of Genesee Valley to the 224th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church USA. We were supposed to gather in a crowd of thousands for a week of discernment, decision, fellowship, worship, and witness in Baltimore, MD. But Covid-19 changed everything with little notice. After the amazing efforts of the national staff and various committees, we gathered virtually over the course of four days. Everything fell down, and then rose again. A little different but risen. We were rewarded with possibility and purpose.

During the more than 30 hours of meeting and event time, all on ZOOM, we commissioners got tired, bored, frustrated, eye sore. And yet we returned, we rose again, plenary after plenary, to do our work and serve our God. We were rewarded with moments of meaning and moments of joy.

The two pandemics of Covid-19 and racism in America had knocked so many of us down for a while. And then we participated in little resurrections. We elected Elona Street-Stewart and Gregory Bentley as co-moderators of the General Assembly. Elona is an indigenous native American woman synod leader, and Gregory is an African American pastor. We chose to be led by two people of color in such a time as this. We chose to be led by voices so often silenced. We rose for a moment.

We also failed to take bold steps on a number of pressing social and justice issues. We collectively sat down at the limits of our energy and willingness to stretch our capacities and leadership patterns. And then we delighted in what we could and did do well. Then many of us chose to take the experience and challenge of the assembly and grow in our own local ministry witness. We are rising again and will be rewarded with a more fully realized kingdom of God in the days to come.

So often we think of resurrection as the incomparable miracle of Easter. The ultimate victory of God's love and power in a broken and violent world. And friends, and, we are a resurrection people. In simple, small, resilient, daily ways, we can rise again and again empowered by grace, hope, and spirit. (cont. on pg. 2)

FAMILY PROMISE UPDATE

Family Promise of Ontario County is alive and well, but the model of our program has changed. Instead of hosting families in our churches, we are supporting our families in apartments, and doing tele case management and training. We are currently assisting 4 families.

Thanks to a grant from the United Way, we are poised to open two apartments to serve as emergency shelter for NEW families. The first new apartment will house a new family on July 1st. FPOC will furnish and stock these apartments. They will stay with us for approx. 2 months. and then move on to permanent housing making way for another family in need.

We could use your help in furnishing these apartments. Below is a list of needs on <u>signup.com</u>. There are small and large items requested, so all can help. We will need help to coordinate the moving of furniture, but small items can be delivered to the Day Center.

Once these apartments are filled, we will be looking for food donations during your regular rotational host week. When we return to regular church family hosting, these apartments will be used as an intermediate step for families, a place for more independence until a rental property becomes available.

Food/Items Needed:

- Rice, pasta and pasta sauce
- Paper products (paper towels, toilet paper, napkins, plastic cutlery—we give these to homeless people)
- Peanut butter (especially small sizes or packs for student lunch boxes)
- small jars of jelly or jam
- Pop-top soup or canned pasta such as Beefaroni
- Canned proteins (chicken, tuna, etc.)
- Condiments ketchup, mustard, relish, cooking oil, mayonnaise, steak sauce, salad dressing, etc.
- Canned fruit of any type
- Juice or juice boxes
- Cereal
- Easy-to-prepare, nutritious, after school snacks: granola bars, Easy Mac, microwave popcorn, crackers and cheese, peanut butter crackers, Go-Gurt (yogurt in tubes)

Food donations are vital to the support of the Food Cupboard and you have the power to help those who are hungry in our community. We service all of Ontario County and on average over 600 families per month. Your food donation makes an instant impact to those who rely on the Food Cupboard for support. During this pandemic we are not accepting food donations at the Food Cupboard location but would be thrilled to have your donation dropped off during one of our drive thru popup food drives! We are happy to accept hunted meat, but only if it has been processed and has a label on it. Fresh fruits and vegetables even from your garden are always welcome! We are NOT allowed to offer or accept any items that are considered medical, including vitamins. Masks are the exception to this rule.
