I love to listen to music and travel.

On my first visit to the First Presbyterian Church in Victor (FPCV), NY, I was enthused by the reception I received from members of the Church during and after service. This gesture from the members of the church confirmed what I had previously read on the church's website before visiting FPCV which reads: "Whoever you are. However you have come. You are welcome here". Again, I was blessed by the ministry of Pastor Colin E. Pritchard. These and many other factors have spurred me on to do my supervised ministry with the church and be a part of this wonderful family. At FPCV, I hope to learn, share my experience, and deepen my understanding of the American culture and get immersed in church life. I have implicit confidence that this opportunity will not only help me meet my course requirement but will also bring a transformation and growth in my life and ministry.


#### SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS


