Grace and Peace to you members and friends:

Lent is a time where we anticipate the new life that comes with spring as the once dead, dormant, deciduous trees and plants bloom with new life. It is also that time in the Christian year where we meditate on our new life that comes from our dying and rising with Jesus Christ. Lent, from the word Lencten, means simply put "spring season, or time," and has a special place in church history where forty days before Easter Christians prepare themselves for the Easter story through prayer and fasting. The fasting aspect has taken on new meaning over the years and people have begun fasting from many different habits, foods, or lifestyle choices. We typically ask the question in Christian circles, "what are you giving up/what have you given up for lent?"

We began our Lenten journey on Ash Wednesday by planting seeds and recalling that "we must consider ourselves dead to sin, and alive to God in Christ." I encouraged us to keep cultivating our plants throughout Lent even as our spiritual lives are cultivated as well. We will need to prune whether that means letting some things die completely in our lives, or saying "no" to certain practices so that more fruit and more life may come, but we will also need nurturing as well. Like plants need water, sunlight, and good soil, so we too metaphorically need the right conditions to grow in our faith. What conditions help us grow? What practices might help us focus in?

Lent has some unique traditional practices that are simple yet profound. Here are two I want us all to try: have one meal a week without any electricity (maybe by candlelight?), and second is start that meal with a single pretzel on your plate and say the pretzel prayer listed below. This simple practice reminds us of two things: first that we have a great deal of privilege and provision already and we should be thankful for all that we have, second is a tangible way to reconnect with God, family, and perhaps even nature. My hope is that even if you try this one time it will have an impact on your life and appreciation for all that God has given and all that God continues to provide for us.

As we heard Jesus say in John's gospel on Ash Wednesday: "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing." Our nourishment as we cultivate our spiritual lives only comes from the vine, Jesus Christ.



You will explore each topic by listening to a short audio (~6 min), watching a short video (~6 min), doing scripture reading (~10 min) and answering 3-4 discussion questions.
