#### FROM PASTOR COLIN

I'm not a huge fan of platitudes of simple catchphrases because they so often bypass context and consequence. Yet, many of clichés are based in something true.

Consider this well known offering: "When God closes a door, somewhere He opens a window."

There are a lot of closed doors right now, including the ones to the sanctuary of your church facility at 70 E Main St. It can be most unhelpful to see this as the choice of God. For to do so means that we have to assume God caused the death of tens of thousands from Covid-19. We would have to believe then that God chose for millions to be unemployed, and brave medical staff to be martyred. I would suggest that this does not align with Holy we know revealed in Jesus our Christ and born witness to in the Gospels.

And yet...there is opportunity in this time of closing. God did not create it, but Christ is with us in it. We can find him in our longing to gather with others in community and communion. We can find him in our compassion for those who are suffering and our desire to help. We can find him in our recognition that all the toys and screens in the world are not better than a laugh, a tear, a hug from a friend.

So there is a window open right now. A path to be the church in a new way is being revealed. We can be the body of Christ, the church if you will, without congregating in a set time and place. How? We worship and study and laugh and cry and pray and serve and choose to seek and speak of Jesus. With those who can hear our voices, we do these things. With those who may be able to see our faces on a computer or phone, we do these things. As the dispersed, and yet unified, people of this church community, we do these things.

While your staff and I are working hard to create openings and offerings for you to do these things, there is also an unprecedented opportunity for you to participate in also leading the ministry here. A window is open. Do you have an idea for hosting fellowship? Do you have a way for people to serve the vulnerable? Do you want to lead a discussion of scripture or other intriguing texts? Can you gather with others (virtually) in prayer?

We will help you coordinate if you are moved in your spirit to lead.

If you are burdened by this season or simply need to be cared for, for a time, know that we are here for you. All that we do is open to you and if you need support accessing these things, simply ask. It is OK to not be OK right now. You are not alone.

Thank you for your participation, faithfulness, service, and generosity. We are the church of open windows, and soon an open door.




