

FAMILY PROMISE

Executive Director Search:

The Board is actively interviewing candidates to become our next Executive Director. We have several great candidates and look forward to filling that critical spot in our roster. We'll keep you posted.

Static Site Update:

In static shelter, families stay overnight at the same location throughout their participation in the Family Promise program. It is a fixed site for families to stay and for volunteers to provide hospitality. The Board is still committed to the static site model as the next step in pursuing our mission to end family homelessness in Ontario County. We will keep you up to date with our progress.

Canandaigua Emergency Shelter Updates:

- Our lease on the Bristol Street apartment expired at the end of May. The landlord decided that he did not wish to rent to the current guest family, and they are seeking other options.
- The guest families in our two apartments on Chapin Street are doing well. The mom in the upstairs apartment who recently got her GED found a better job. She and her partner are now working together with a local landscaping company while making progress saving for a new car and seeking affordable housing. Their little boy turns two in August! The mom in the downstairs apartment is also working two jobs, at an adult care home and a local diner, while caring for her two boys and her infant girl. She is dealing with postpartum depression that ebbs and flows, yet still managing to work hard on finding appropriate housing.
- The mom of three children at our Saltonstall Street apartment is struggling with a legal issue that may impact her ability to remain in our program. We should have clarity soon.



First Presbyterian Church in Victor, Victor's first church, was founded in 1798. This congregation represented the Christian faith of New England settlers, their Protestant theology, and their pioneering spirit. From this beginning our faith community constructed two houses of worship and completed numerous upgrades to keep pace with the needs of the growing congregation for worship, education, fellowship and celebration. Over the past two centuries our church has evolved in many ways to become "the white church with the tall steeple on Main Street" that welcomes our community to gather in Christian faith and fellowship and to be the servants of Jesus Christ.



Events of the Day

History of the First Presbyterian Church in Victor - David Henderson and Babette Huber (Historian for the Town and the Village of Victor) will give an in-depth presentation showing how FPCV evolved from meeting in private homes to the Proprietor's Meeting House on Piety Hill to the present day.
