Greetings in the Name of the Lord!

As many of you know, I left ordained parish ministry for a few years to pursue my Masters of Education. During those few years, when people asked me what I did, I told them I was a Science Teacher, and that often led to conversations about how people either liked science class or didn't.

Now that I am back to being a Pastor, I am remembering that when I tell folks I am a pastor, the response really isn't all that different, although unfortunately these days, it's not always a positive conversation. I try hard to listen to the critiques that are offered to me, many of them very, very valid. More often than not I realize someone's scathing critique of "religion" is really a commentary on a particular denomination, or specific church or even a specific leader.

Sometimes I try and explain that that is not what I do or that is not what I represent or that is not what I hope for, but usually all I can really do is listen and hope to learn something from their experience, hopefully something I can share back to the church to make our community healthier, more responsible and more firmly rooted in the love of Christ.

One thing that has started to become fairly clear to me is that rarely does the contemporary church do a good job of explaining why it exists. Too many people outside the church think we are just trying to get everyone to think a specific way, or that we are obsessed with getting into heaven. (cont. pg.2)

*This is truly the way to worship God.”*

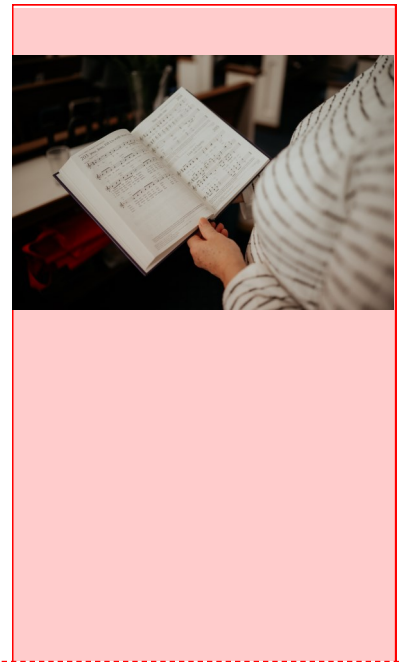

Another way to share in the experience of worship is to take part in the music that graces our worship. We have a choir sharing their gifts of song with everyone and we are always willing to welcome more voices to join and to make a joyful noise with us. Maybe your talent comes in a different form.

We have the blessing of being able to broadcast our worship services every week through our YouTube channel and have only a few people to share in that responsibility to get God's word out to those not able to be present for whatever reason. If you are blessed to have the gift to work with electronics it would be a definite way to give your body (talent) to God, fulfilling Paul's words to the church in Rome.

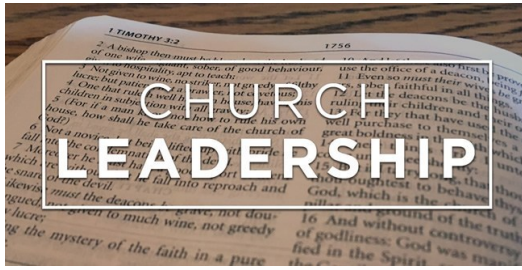

The Victor Farmington Food Cupboard has had a very busy year! We serve a monthly average of 595 households that include 900 adults, 570 children and 350 seniors. We can accomplish this with 115 hard working volunteers.

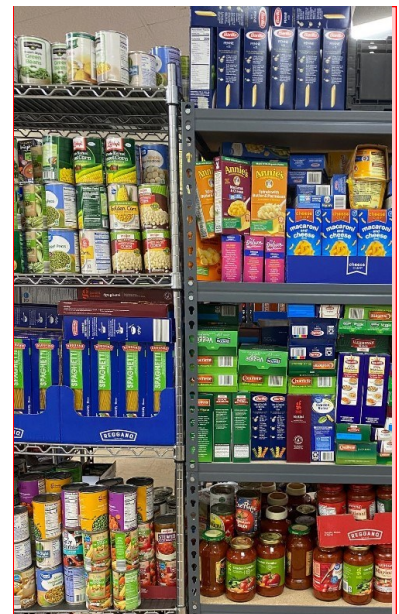
Our hours are Mon., Wed. and Fri. mornings 9:30 to 11:15 am, Wed. and Thurs. evenings 5:30 to 7:15 pm.

We will have an in person donations drop off Saturday July 13 and August 10 at the Food Cupboard at 6548 Anthony Dr., Victor, NY from 9am to 11 am. Donations can also be made at any time in our donation bin on the side of the building.

We will have a tent at the Victor and Farmington Farmers Markets. Items needed are: pasta, jarred spaghetti sauce, kids snacks, fruit, shampoo dish soap, Laundry detergent and cereal. We strive to be a healthy food cupboard and always appreciate produce from home gardens. Cash donations are always accepted and we have a Wish List on Amazon website.

The food cupboard will be at the Nora Jones concert at CMAC on July 5th in the Chairs for Charity booth which rents out lawn chairs for \$5 and all donations go to the food cupboard. Come and enjoy an evening of great music and rent a lawn chair.

### **Emergency Shelter Program Update**

FPOC provides shelter and case management services to homeless families with children through four apartments in Geneva and Canandaigua. As you know, we are also working on the shelter project, which will increase our capacity to help an additional seven families at a time once our shelter is open. Below are a couple of success stories from this past month in which our team made a difference to the families in our shelter program.

- Our case management team successfully helped two of our guests obtain new employment over the past month. The team is now working with these families on budgeting and helping them save money for a security deposit and the first month's rent.
- Our ability to provide shelter for one family in our shelter program has helped reunite and strengthen a family unit. Before entering our program, a single mom had been couch surfing at a friend's house with her young son while her two daughters were living with the girl's father. By having a safe, secure place to live, she has spent more time with her daughters while working with the case management team on her long-term goals of sustainable housing. 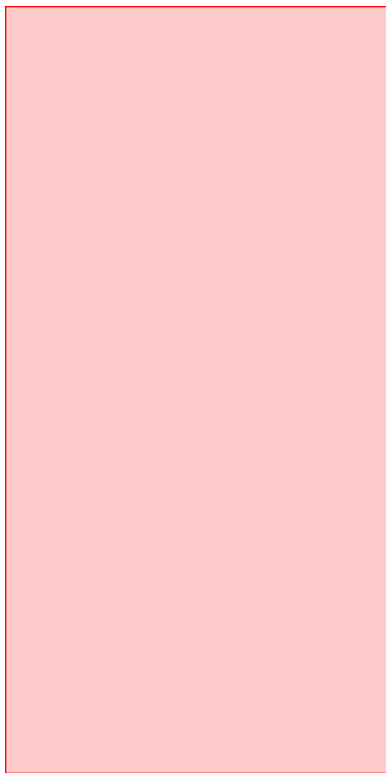
